Re: Gosfield North Communications Co-operative Limited – Request to extend service areas of registered exempt terrestrial IPTV BDU that operates in markets with licenced BDUs.

Dear Mr. Petruk,

This is in response to the request by Gosfield North Communications Co-operative Limited (Gosfield) to amend the service areas of its exempt terrestrial IPTV broadcasting distribution undertaking (BDU) serving Cottam, Ontario (with secondary locations to Cottam, Ontario in Belle River, Emeryville, Woodslee, Pleasant Park). The extended areas would include a new main location in Caledonia, Ontario with secondary locations in Sims Locks, and York. Gosfield is currently operating as an exempt BDU pursuant to *Revised exemption order for terrestrial broadcasting distribution undertakings serving fewer than 20,000 subscribers, Broadcasting Regulatory Policy CRTC 2015-543 and Broadcasting Order CRTC 2015-544, 9 December 2015* (the BDU Exemption Order).

Based on the information you have provided, we have concluded that Gosfield can operate the undertaking in question with its amended service areas pursuant to the BDU Exemption Order. Therefore the undertaking name and locations will be added to the List of Registered Exempt Terrestrial BDUs that Operate in Markets with Licenced BDUs shortly.

We remind you that the onus is on the registrant to ensure that it meets all requirements set out in the BDU Exemption Order at all times. Should any of the undertakings reach 21,000 subscribers in any two consecutive broadcasting years, it will no longer be eligible and must apply for a licence.
